



- In all other section's entries may be delivered from Wednesday, 6th November to Show Office.
- Stewards have the right to move exhibits if they deem it is in an incorrect class.
- Judging will take place on Thursday 14th November.
- The Pavilion will be open for viewing on Friday 15th Nov from 9am and all Pavilion exhibits will remain on display until approx. 5pm Saturday, 16th November
- Please do not remove certificates from display before 5pm Saturday. All prize winners are listed in the Show Office.
- The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit, or if the exhibits are not considered 'worthy'.
- Pavilion prize monies may be collected from the Show Office on SATURDAY BETWEEN 10A.M. AND 6PM ONLY. There will be NO prizemoney available to be collected other than at the allocated time.

HINTS FOR EXHIBITING:

- Never turn your cake onto a wire cake cooler, the marks will be regarded as decoration. Place your cake on tea towels.
- Do not trim your cake
- Storing your cake in plastic containers or bags prior to judging may draw moisture. For best results use cellophane.
- For 'show judging' slices should be 5cm x 3cm & best not to exhibit edge pieces.
- If baking for competition in weeks prior to show, leave cake out to cool until you are sure there is no heat
 left within the cake before freezing. Defrost the cake the day before entry, preferably overnight and then
 iced if necessary.
- When 'show baking', "Cook as though you are baking for the Queen."

RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

39.The following recipe is comp

250g sultanas 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250g butter 250 g chopped raisins 250 g plain flour 250g soft brown sugar

250 g currants
60 g self-raising flour
1/2 teaspoon almond essence
125 g chopped mixed peel
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

90 g chopped red glace cherries 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 4 large eggs

90 g chopped blanched almonds 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR

finely grated lemon rind.

RECOMMENDED METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square $20 \text{cm} \times 20 \text{cm} (8" \times 8")$ tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately $3 \frac{1}{2} - 4$ hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity & depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 -3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Prize money is sponsored by the Ag Shows NSW. Winners at country shows will each receive a cash prize of \$25 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW. The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$50 and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.00.

Note: In any year an individual competitor may participate in only one Group Final representing a Show Society and, consequently, may represent only one Group

Bangalow winner will be required to have their second cake available for Group Judging in Lismore late November (exact date TBA)

40. SHOW COOKERY CHALLENGE - CHOCOLATE & ORANGE MARBLE BUNDT CAKE

185 g (6oz) butter, softened 1½ cups caster sugar 3 eggs, room temperature

1 ¾ cups self- raising flour ¼ cup plain flour ¼ cup milk

2 tablespoons cocoa powder 1 tablespoon milk, extra 1 tablespoon icing sugar

1 tablespoon finely grated orange rind 1 tablespoon fresh squeezed orange juice

- 1: Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease bundt tin with butter and a dusting of cocoa powder, tap out excess cocoa powder.
- 2: Beat butter and sugar in a small bowl with an electric mixer on medium speed until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs one art a time. Stir in combined sifted flours and milk until just combined.
- 3. Divide mixture evenly between two medium bowls. Stir sifted cocoa and extra milk into one bowl of mixture. Stir rind and orange juice into second bowl.
- 4. Spread one third of the chocolate mixture into pan. Level the mixture with the back of spoon. Top with one third of orange mixture. Repeat layering two more times then gently tap the pan on work surface to remove any air pockets.

This process is very similar to making a classic marble cake, however unlike a marble cake we won't be drawing a skewer through the batter to create a marble patter. The natural effects of gravity and heat act upon the batter, causing it to swirl into more subtle shapes that resemble tiger stripes.

5. Bake for 50 mins or until cooked. Leave cake in pan for 5 minutes before turning onto a covered wire rack to cool. Just before serving dust with sifted icing sugar.

Prizemoney: Each of the 14 Group final winning entries will receive a cash prize of \$50 and the state final winning entry will receive a cash prize of \$100.00, sponsored by AG Shows NSW

CONDITIONS:

- **1**. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - a) Garment: an item that can be worn eg. dress, jacket, scarf, hat
 - **b)** Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home eg. blanket; with an outfit eg. bag; for amusement eg. toy; as a decoration eg. picture etc.
 - c) Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose: eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR
 - eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
- 2. All articles/garments must contain a minimum of, 80% SHEEP wool, excluding lining, to qualify for competition
- **3**. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
- **4.** A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice."
- **5.** An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- **6.** All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- **10.** If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.






